Dear Senator Bradford:

The Health Officers Association of California (HOAC) and the County Health Executives Association of California (CHEAC), representing California's 61 county and city local health department physician health officers and health executives, are pleased to support AB 263 by Assembly Member Joaquin Arambula which would require a private detention facility operator to comply with and adhere to all local and state public health orders and occupational safety and health regulations.

California law recognizes the importance of protecting public health by empowering and requiring local health officers to take actions as necessary to prevent the spread of disease. As realized during the COVID-19 pandemic, outbreaks in congregate settings, including private detention facilities, pose significant risks to those residing in such settings, as well as the broader communities in which these facilities are located.

During public health emergencies, it is paramount that operators of private detention facilities comply with local and state public health orders and guidance to ensure the safety of detainees, employees, and the surrounding community. This measure confirms the ability of local health officials to take actions necessary to protect the public's health by clarifying that all private detention facilities in California, including those contracted by the federal government, must abide by public health orders and regulations.
